Chile is home to approximately 450 species of birds, many of them endemic.

Cindy, a trained professional familiar with the region and its bird species, will assist you in observation and graphic recording of the varied birdlife.

The Hurricane 920 will transport you from The Atmosphere to untouched wetlands, inhabited by whistling ducks, dabbling ducks, diving ducks, false geese & the spectacular Chilean kingfisher. Scout the amazing Patagonian sierra finch, dressed in its eye-catching orange and yellow tailcoat.

Return to the ship

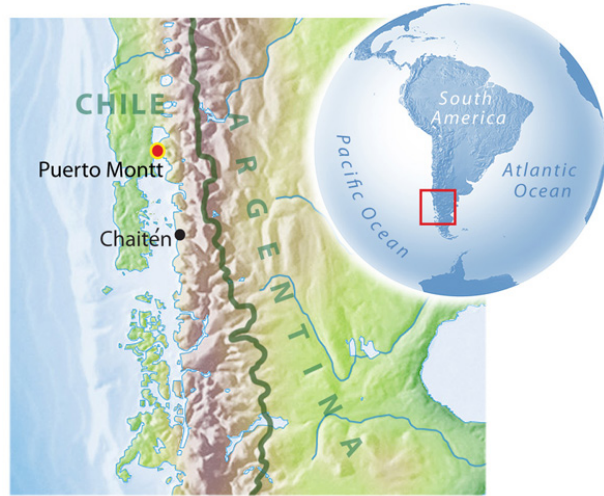
Watch from the helicopter as the sun melts into the horizon on one side and the moon rises full from the water on the other.

to: get ready

You'll need a valid passport to enter Chile and for check-in aboard the Atmosphere. No shots or vaccinations are required. Don't exchange a good deal of money. While the peso is the currency of Chile, many places accept the dollar, and once aboard the Atmosphere you'll not need cash. You may want to brush up on a few key Spanish phrases, but most people speak English.

to: pack

When it comes to your wardrobe, think layers. You'll be dressing for multiple climates: glaciers, lagoons, jungles, etc. The coldest months are rarely below 4°C / 39°F, while on warmer days the temperature may rise to 20° C/ 68° F. The summer season-January, February & middle of March-calls for lighter-weight clothes. May through October are the coldest and rainiest months of the year. Bring waterproof everything. Toss in sunscreen, lip balm, polarized sunglasses, a world adaptor, and a camera.

to: get there The most direct route to Patagonia is through Santiago, Chile. From there, you'll take a short flight to Puerto Montt. LAN airlines (www.lan.com) offers more flights to Chile, in and out of Miami, than any other airline. A Nomads guide will meet you at the airport in Puerto Mott and take you to the dock where you will board the Atmosphere.

to: stay

Patagonia remains one of the rare, untamed corners on the globe. To keep it that way, there are very few accommodations in the wilderness of Patagonia, and none better than the Atmosphere itself, which boasts all of the amenities of a five-star hotel. Plus, it even rocks you to sleep at night. But keep in mind that while you are onboard the Atmosphere, you will be without Internet, cell phone service (there is an emergency use only phone in the captain's deck), postal service, or media access.

to: eat and drink

One of the highlights of Chilean cuisine is its fresh seafood: lobster, ceviche, and salmon. On the Atmosphere, it is all served to delicious perfection. Try the Pisco Sour, a Chilean favorite, which is a sweet brandy made from the skin of white grapes. Another indulgence not to be missed while in Chile is its famous red wine, which has attained international status. Malbec is a TO favorite.
